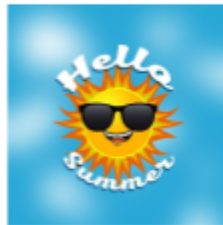

## The 15th Annual Young Musicians Series

The Chautauqua Historical Society is pleased to present the 15th Annual Young Musicians Series featuring the **Peccate Quartet at 8:00 pm on June 12 in the auditorium.**

The Peccate Quartet is a competition group of the Preparatory Program of the Community Music School of Webster University. Jointly sponsored by the Chamber Music Society of St. Louis (CMSSL), the Peccate Quartet is comprised of:

- Nathan Bronstein, violin
- Delia Zacks, viola
- Natalie Van Winkle, cello

All members are also seasoned participants in the St. Louis Symphony Youth Orchestra.

The Peccate Quartet participated in the Midwest Young Artists National Chamber Music Competition earlier this year, and appeared in pre-concert Preludes for CMSSL, and a special concert series of their own. The individual members are excellent soloists as well, and winners of numerous St. Louis regional concerto competitions.

For their June 12th Chautauqua debut, the Peccate Quartet will perform great works of the string quartet repertoire, some duos and solos, and end with a big band medley. Featured works will be the effervescent "Sunrise" Quartet of Haydn, Schubert's Quartettsatz, Shostakovich's mesmerizing 8th quartet, and the energetic Dvorak "American" Allegro. The Peccate Quartet will be assisted by Vera Parkin of Community Music School.

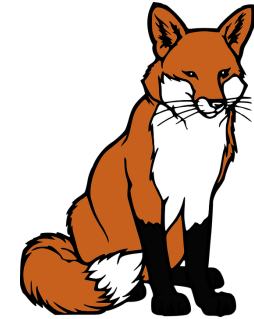
## 10:45 Lecture Series

Kevin Parentin of the Bridlespur Hunt Club will kick-off the 2022 **10:45 Lecture Series on Monday, June 13 in Town Hall.**

About his presentation, Kevin writes:

The popular misconception of fox hunting is that it exists only on the old-fashioned prints and dinnerware commonly found in antique shops. Further, most believe it's a pastime only for the privileged. In fact, fox hunting's rich history belongs to the commoners, farmers, yeomanry, and noblemen who—together—established the sport by creating the culture and traditions to which we still abide.

Fox hunting is still a popular sport among equestrians in France, England, Italy, and the US. In American fox hunting, the object is not to kill a fox, whose rare and idyllic presence is preserved rather than ended. Instead of a kill, it is the thrill of galloping cross-country, following hounds, and leaping fences that excites participants of the sport. It is also much more than that. In my presentation, I will explain the culture that exists quietly in our region.

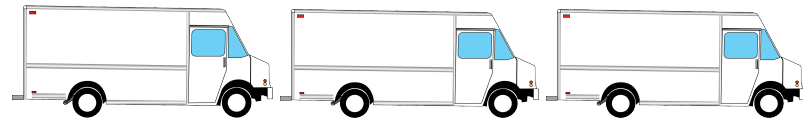

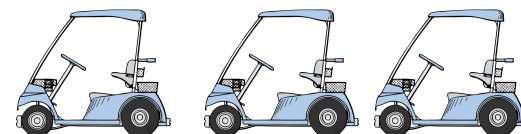
## ATTENTION ALL SEASONAL EMPLOYEES!

### **The Plein-Air Chautauqua Event**

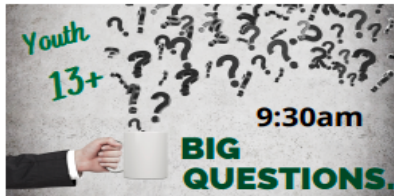
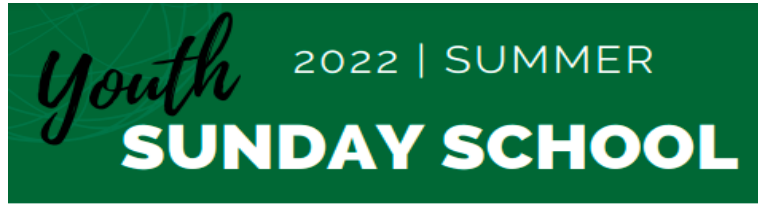

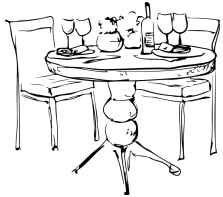
