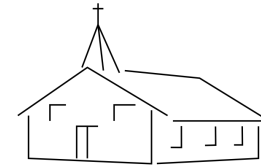

Welcome to Chautauqua

Each community has their own rules and regulations. Some rules of our community are designed to make your stay pleasant and memorable for all concerned, these are listed below. To see the full list of the rules and regulations please refer to the program book or newpiasachautauqua.org.

The Children of Chautauqua are our Future. Please watch out for them no matter where you are and treat them like your own.

Vehicles yield to golf carts, golf carts yield to bikers, bikers yield to pedestrians.

Everyone yields to pedestrians!

Alcohol: consumption of alcohol, regardless of age, is prohibited on Chautauqua Common Grounds. Any person under the age of 21 found to be under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs shall be subject to the sanctions of the Board of Directors, in addition to any punishment imposed by local, state, or federal law.

Animals: All owners are responsible for the sanitary disposal of their pets' feces. Do not put in the creek. Also, be aware of your pet causing a nuisance when you are away from your cottage. Remember your neighbors when you leave... be kind, no one likes a barking dog.

Bicycles: not allowed on sidewalks, boardwalk or tennis courts. All bikes must have a light at night-See Shannon O'Hearne Meyer if needed for your child's bike.

Curfew: For all individuals under 18, Sunday through Thursday 11pm. Friday and Saturday 12am.

Firearms: Discharging of guns, Firearms, or fireworks anywhere in Chautauqua is prohibited at all times.

GOLF CARTS: **SPEED LIMIT 10 MPH**, only to be driven on roadways, 5 persons only to a cart, NO Standing on golf cart when in motion, NO parking on the HARBOR BERM, and MUST have lights to operate at night.

Guests: Guests are subject to all the Rules and Regulations. Lessees are responsible for the conduct of their guests at all times whether the guest is present in-season or out of season and regardless of lessee's presence or absence.

Pool: Appropriate swimwear required. Men must wear swim trunks, No Speedos or Cut-Off jeans. Women must wear full coverage bikini bottoms, NO thongs or extremely cheeky bikini bottoms.

Vehicles: All Gasoline and Electric powered vehicles on the grounds the **SPEED LIMIT is 10 MPH**. All stop signs must be obeyed. No one shall operate an automobile or GOLF CART without a valid driver's license from the state he/she resides in.

Quiet Hours: Sunday through Thursday 11 pm to 8:00 am, Friday and Saturday 12 midnight to 8am. On Sundays during Church Service there will be no playing of Tennis and no playground use from 11am to 12:15pm.

Smoking: Smoking and the use of vapor smoking devices is not allowed on the common grounds or in any public building. Use of legalized marijuana is now limited to the leaseholder's cottage. As always, please be considerate of others.
