CARDBOARD BOAT REGATTA IS THIS SATURDAY!

10:00 AM to Noon - Boat Registration

2:00 PM Sharp - Regatta Begins!

Put down that paint brush and put on your swimming suit! Be ready because it gets warm watching the race and we'll have breaks for spectators to jump in the pool to cool off.



Registration - 10 AM to Noon - please bring:

- Your completed boat
- Names & Ages of the boaters who will be in your boat
- Cash to pay for the materials you used to make your boat (\$10 ea cardboard sheet, \$5 ea masking tape roll, extra donations are truly appreciated!!)
- Paddles

All boats and boaters must be registered and paid for by noon on race day. Any late arrivals will only be allowed to participate if the organizers determine there is time and room to add them.

Race Heats will be divided by age groups and number of boaters (single or multiple). Age groups will be determined by the oldest in the boat. If you want to keep your boat for another year or to display it, please make sure it is out of the pool area as soon as your final race is completed. (We may have room above the Wood Shop for off season storage if needed.)

At the conclusion of the races, we will have a demolition derby. Each boater will have the opportunity to race and to participate in the demolition derby at the end, if they wish. Every boat will receive recognition for its special attributes during the awards ceremony after the event so please stick around.

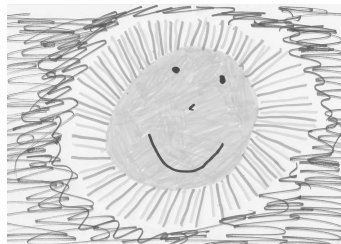

Events 12/13: 21-40 Women's/Men's Freestyle (2 widths)

Events 16/17: 10 and older Women's/Men's Individual Medley (100 IM): (Butterfly/Backstroke/Breaststroke/Freestyle)

Relays: All relays are 4 widths total

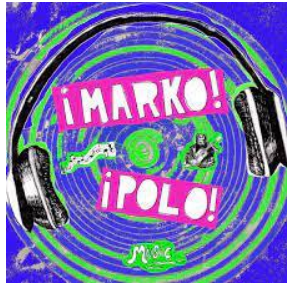
Event 18: Medley Relay: (Backstroke/Breaststroke/Butterfly/Freestyle)

Event 19: Family Relay: (Freestyle - all swimmers must be descendents of the same set of grandparents. Spouses of descendents are included).

Event 20: Sweatshirt Relay (A Swim Classic classic! - this one needs no explanation!) Bring your own sweatshirt to represent your school or college.

Only one needed per team. **Notes:** If we have a large number of swimmers in a given event, we may break it down into multiple heats with a final. The final will include top 3 finishers from each heat.

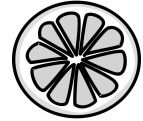

It's Time to Remember Safety:

→CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS, FIRE EXTINGUISHERS, SMOKE DETECTORS
- have in each living space and service them.

→MOSQUITO BITES – use heat to quickly relieve mosquito bite, itch and swelling!

→SPIDER BITES – wash with soap and water, use ice and Benadryl to help the itching.
Watch for signs of infection like red streaking and see a doctor if infection is present.

→TICKS – use fine-tipped tweezers to slowly pull out the tick. Wash the bite area and your hands with soap and water.

→STINGS – remove the stinger, wash the site with soap and water, cover site with a bandage and keep it clean.

→POISON IVY – the rash is caused by an allergic reaction to the oily resin urushiol. If exposed to poison ivy, wash skin and hands with soap and water and wash your clothing. Even dead poison ivy plants can have active urushiol.

→EMERGENCY dial 911 from a cottage phone. Dial 618-498-6881 from a cell phone.

→AED (Automated External Defibrillator) units are used for cardiac arrest. Chautauqua has 2 AED units located:

- o Pool lifeguard office

- o Administration building, mounted on outside wall on the right of the building as you face the front door

→KEEP COOL to prevent heat exhaustion and heat stroke. If someone experiences a heat related illness, move the person out of the heat/sun, loosen clothing, apply cool wet cloth to skin, spray person with cool water and fan them, have person sip cool water

→BIKES – install a light on bikes and watch for people walking on the roads of Chautauqua
