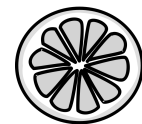

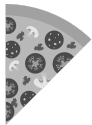

RIVER CUP CHALLENGE 2022

The Challenge this year was initiated by **Helena Roberts and Megan Meyer (O’Hearne) and joined by Miles, Melissa, and Scott Kelley (Young) and a last-minute entry of Victoria Kirchhoff (Bick) and Phoebe Hendrickson (Bick).**

The three boats rocketed out from under the Chautauqua bridge at 7:15 Sunday morning, July 24, and by 7:30 the reality of just how far it is across the Mississippi River set in. The limits of cardboard, when stressed by Kelley muscle, became obvious when the boat came apart and went down with all hands halfway to Slim Island.

The remaining two boats rounded the foot of Slim with the older girls in a comfortable lead and the younger girls making a few circles, but eventually straightening up and giving chase. At the top of Slim Island, the boats turned for home and the race was on in earnest. It was looking like a possible photo finish, but once again the outcome was determined, not as much by strength of muscle as strength of cardboard.
