

10:45 am Lecture Series Presents: Cahokia Mounds – A Treasure in Our Backyard

Southern Illinois has been occupied by American Indian cultural traditions since 9500 BC. **On Monday, August 22 at 10:45 in Town Hall, William Iseminger**, an archaeologist who recently retired as Assistant Site Manager at Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site in Collinsville will review these traditions--their lifestyles, artifacts, beliefs and customs. Culture change between time periods will be discussed, from that of the earliest Paleo-Indian nomads who hunted mammoths and mastodons; the Archaic period, with its introduction of horticulture and mound building; the Woodland period that introduced pottery, the

bow and arrow and corn agriculture; to the Mississippian period, with its expanded agriculture, massive mounds and large permanent settlements. Iseminger will focus especially on the rise and demise of Cahokia. Mr. Iseminger has written extensively about archaeology and Cahokia Mounds.

This week, copies of the monograph “Economics Essentials” will be distributed. It illustrates the basic tools of economics by employing them in solving a problem of time allocation, specifically how much study time should a student devote to a couple of classes, e.g., history and biology. The tools developed are

demand, supply, and production possibilities; tools sufficient for analyzing human exchange. Nobel laureate Milton Friedman was once asked for the essence of economics. His reply was “demand and supply, everything else is merely elaboration.”
