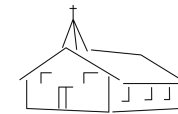
## Mask Up and Dress Up for the Chautauqua Masquerade Ball

## CHS Lecture Series Presents New Insights About the Cahokia Mounds

The CHS Lecture Series welcomes Alleen Betzenhauser, PhD, of the Illinois State Archaeological Survey to **Town Hall on Sunday, July 10 at 7 pm**. She will discuss her recent research entitled: "Corn, Clay, and Cahokian Communities".

Dr. Betzenhauser will share recent research in the American Bottom region of Illinois stemming from the Illinois State Archaeological

Survey's excavations at the East St. Louis site from 2008–2012 for the Illinois Department of Transportation. She will highlight new insights about corn processing and potting practices, and how they relate to community identity during the early Mississippian period (ca. AD 1050–1200) in and near Cahokia Mounds.

**Chuck Bryant** will tell us about "What It Takes To Be An Army Ranger" on **Monday, July 11 in Town Hall**. Chuck served in the US Army's 3<sup>rd</sup> Ranger Bn/75<sup>th</sup> Ranger Regiment from 1987 to 1991. During his tenure, Chuck completed several specialized schools including Airborne, Demolition, Sniper, and Jumpmaster, and was "Top Gun" of US Army Sniper School. In December of 1989, he participated in an airborne assault on Rio Hato, Panama as part of Operation Just Cause. The lecture will focus on the training he received, the organizational structure of the special operations community, and some of his experiences as a Ranger.

A great Chautauqua favorite, the Cardboard Boat Regatta, will take place **Saturday, July 23. Registration is from 10am to noon. Races begin at 2pm.** The race is open to all ages and no experience is necessary. Adults can compete in the Single Sheet race.

### PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT BOATMAKING:

- Boats may be crafted with cardboard, LATEX paint and masking tape. **Nothing else!**
- The Woodshop is officially open and ready for boatmakers. (The Woodshop is located across the creek and behind Town Hall.)
- Children under 14 must be supervised by an adult in the Woodshop at ALL times. If we find any unaccompanied children, they will promptly be escorted out and sent home. (We are very serious about this. The knives are very sharp and we do not want anyone getting hurt. We will, however, happily teach anyone who wants to learn proper knife safety!)
- Supplies are available for purchase in the Woodshop
  - \$10 - 4x8 sheet of preprimed cardboard
  - \$5 - roll of masking tape
- If you have old latex paint that has not been frozen, please bring it to the Woodshop to donate to the cause. Extra masking tape is also greatly appreciated.
- Once your boat is made, please take it to your cottage to store.

### RACE DAY DETAILS:

At the Regatta, each boater over the age of 5 will have the opportunity to compete in two races.

Every boat will receive recognition and major awards will be given for:

- First Place
- First Place, 5 & Under
- Single Sheet (as the name implies, boats in this race can only be made from one sheet of cardboard; adults can compete in this race)

## Lagniappe (New Orleans speak for 'a little something extra' pronounced lan-yap)

Hello, Chautauqua! Since we are rolling into "Teen Week" I thought it would be fun to do a piece on Young Adult Fiction (YA); an underappreciated genre--full of gems--that I've taken a fairly deep dive into, mostly at the recommendation of my daughter, Kate. So...I'm going to let her take it from here. ~DW

### Y.A. Lit--A Primer for Newcomers

Young adult literature is so much more than literature for young adults. In a world dominated by older and middle-aged writers and readers, Y.A. lit stands up for the thoughts, feelings, and experiences of teens--and reminds adult readers just how complicated, scary, and joyous being a teen can really be. For anyone curious about the wide, deep world of Y.A. lit and all it has to offer, here are five essential reads to get you started:

#### *The Hate U Give* by Angie Thomas, 2017

Angie Thomas's debut novel about a 16-year-old girl who witnesses a police shooting is essential reading: both for its tragic and timeless story, and for its candid, funny, nuanced, and authentic portrait of growing up Black in a white world.

#### *Hatchet* by Gary Paulsen, 1986

It's a classic for a reason. Gary Paulsen's lean, mean book about a 13-year-old boy trying to survive in the Canadian wilderness after a plane crash will stay with you forever. It's amazing how the author tells such a riveting story with just one character, one setting, and almost no dialogue.

#### *The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian* by Sherman Alexie, 2007

Funny, frank, and phenomenally illustrated, this gem of a YA novel tells the autobiographical story of one Native American teen coming of age at an all-white prep school. It's both brutally honest, and laugh-out-loud hilarious.

#### *Monster* by Walter Dean Myers, 1999

A Black high school student and aspiring filmmaker finds himself in the wrong place at the wrong time and must stand trial for a murder he didn't commit. Told partly in diary entries, and partly in the format of a movie script, *Monster* is a must-read for anyone who loves a great courtroom drama.

#### *The Book Thief* by Markus Zusak, 2005

This beautiful and haunting World War II-era novel breaks all the rules and writes a few of its own, with an awesome girl protagonist and a story narrated by Death. (yes, Death.) Brace yourself--this one is a life-changer.

Katlyn Minard is a writer whose young adult fiction has appeared in *Capulet Magazine*, *Lunch Ticket*, *Moon City Review*, and other literary journals.
